2022 FCOE HONORS HONOREE BIOGRAPHIES

ACADEMICS



Larry L. Powell

Larry L. Powell was elected to two terms as Superintendent of Fresno County Schools and served 43 years in education. Under his leadership he created numerous programs to help improve education in Fresno County, including the establishment of The Foundation @ FCOE. He is a member of the National Advisory Board for Rachel's Challenge, the premier anti-bullying program in America. Larry was the Chair of California's School Fiscal Crisis Management Assistance Team Board during the height of the fiscal crisis in California. He loves inspiring others and has served on many non-profit boards and is a Member of the Board of Trustees for Fresno Pacific University. Larry has received numerous recognitions including the 2003 Superintendent of the Year for the Association of California School Administrators; 2007 California State University, Fresno's "Top Dog" as an Outstanding Alumni of the University; 2010 Distinguished Citizen Award; and in 2011 was honored with the Horizon Award for his work in promoting the arts. Struck with Polio at the age of 15 months in 1949, Larry is an inspiration to everyone he meets. Larry has made equity and access a hallmark of his career and is passionate about his faith and family.

AGRICULTURE



Tony Campos

Tony Campos was born in Orondritz, Spain, and immigrated to the United States when he was 17 years old. In 1971, Tony began to grow almonds with his two brothers in Caruthers and built the first Campos family almond huller in 1981. The Campos family shares a passion for agriculture, and Tony stands as an industry leader in almond production and premium quality processing. Year after year, Tony, along with his family, continue to deliver the highest quality of California almonds. He has built a legacy of stewardship, philanthropy, and strong family values. Tony and the Campos family are committed to supporting agricultural, religious, and educational organizations. Tony is a strong supporter of students at Caruthers High School, the community where his family farm is located, and the children at Valley Children's Hospital.

ARTS



Lilia Gonzáles-Chávez

Lilia Gonzáles-Chávez is a Fresno native, where she has been an active advocate for the arts for over 40 years. Lilia is a performing artist with over 30 years teaching and performing Ballet Folklórico. She served on the boards of the Fresno Art Museum and Fresno Arts Council prior to being appointed Executive Director in August 2011. Under her leadership, the Fresno Arts Council established the Rural Outreach Fund to support transportation of artists and audiences to rural communities. She is a co-founder of Arte America's, the Latino cultural arts center. Lilia was appointed to serve on the California Arts Council by Governor Newsom in 2020. She was essential to the Community Arts Team in developing the Any Given Child plan for Fresno. Lilia created a teaching artists training program to increase participation of local artists in schools and she is credited for establishing the Fresno Poet Laureate program.

ATHLETICS



Jared Schmidt

Jared Schmidt was born in Fresno, California, and grew up in the areas of Coarsegold, Fresno, and Clovis. While attending Gibson Elementary in Fresno Unified, Jared's teachers encouraged him to get involved with the Special Olympics sporting events, launching his athletic career. In 2003, with coaching from his parents and Break the Barriers, Jared represented the United States Special Olympics Team in Ireland, winning six medals in gymnastics, including three silver medals and one gold in the All Around. In 2009, he represented the United States in downhill skiing at the World Games, Idaho, winning three silver medals. He is a Global Messenger for Special Olympics International, giving speeches to education, promoting the mission, and encouraging athlete participation, volunteerism, and support for the cause. Jared is a key team member of Break the Barriers, where he has taken up archery, winning second place at the 2021 Vegas Shoot Championship. Jared loves to dance, ride his horse, watch movies, and spend time with family.
