

2017 FCOE HONORS HONOREE BIOGRAPHIES

Academics



Delbert Cederquist

Delbert Cederquist, an Easton-area grape grower, has been a school board member for 64 years, serving longer than any school trustee in California, as well as the nation. First elected at the age of 21 to the University Colony School District board, he has played an active role in education ever since. He was elected to the Fresno County Board of Education in 1994 and is presently in his fifth, four-year term. The county board oversees more than 190,000 students and provides services to 32 school districts in Fresno County. Delbert is an active member of the Fresno County School Trustees Association and served as statewide president in 1977. He is recognized both locally and statewide for his knowledge, expertise and commitment to education.

Agriculture



Carol Chandler

Carol Chandler received her bachelor's degree from the University of California, Davis and her master's degree from California State University, Fresno. Before joining the family farm, growing grapes, peaches, plums, citrus and almonds, Carol taught in the San Joaquin Valley, including Fresno City College. She is the past state president of California Women for Agriculture, is a member of the CSU Fresno Water Task Force and serves on the UC President's Advisory Commission on Agriculture and Natural Resources and the California State University Board of Trustees. The California State Legislature named Carol as Woman of the Year in 1992 and 2002. Today, Carol is a partner in Chandler Farms and a longtime advocate for agriculture and education.

Arts



Yukari Thiesen

Yukari Thiesen, at age five living in Japan, dreamed of being a ballerina. She pursued this dream from being a young ballerina at the Matsuyama Ballet School in Tokyo, Japan, to California's Central Valley. Years later, she founded the Valley Performing Arts Council in Fresno. She works with the Sacramento Ballet each year for the Nutcracker and the Santa Barbara Ballet for its spring performance, showcasing professional dancers, as well as maximizing the number of local dancer participation as well. She currently teaches dance through the prestigious Kennedy Center sponsored Any Given Child program across Fresno County schools. From Sleeping Beauty to the Nutcracker, over 132,000 grade school students from 25 school districts attend her ballet programs annually.

Athletics



Margie Wright

Margie Wright was a high school and college softball pitching sensation growing up in Illinois. She was hired by Fresno State in 1985 as the head softball coach, a position she held for 27 years. She led Fresno State to a national championship in 1998. She is the NCAA's all-time winningest softball coach. As of 2009, she had coached 53 All-Americans, 16 Academic All-Americans, 11 NCAA team statistical champions, eight professionals and 15 Olympians. The Bulldog Diamond was renamed the Margie Wright Diamond by Fresno State in 2014. Off the field, Margie has been a passionate advocate for numerous causes, as well as a highly sought-after softball clinician and motivational speaker. Today, she focuses her efforts on travel softball for young female athletes.
